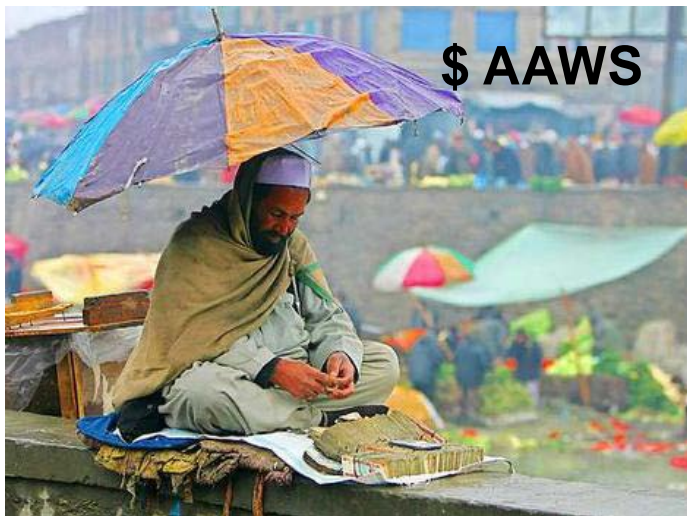

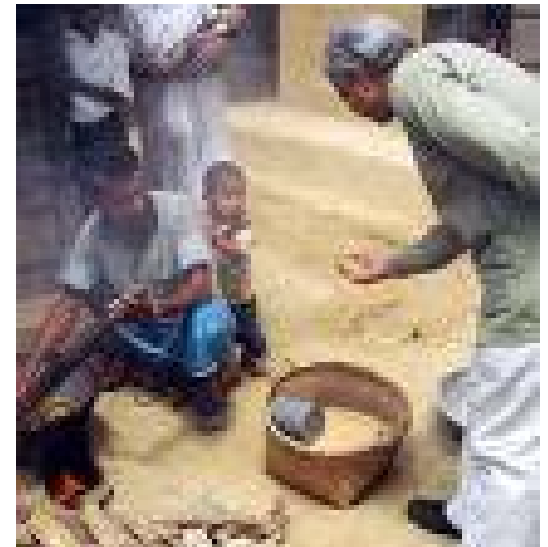

Stabilization -- Once Again a National-Security Goal



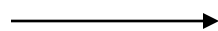
Then

Nonpartisanship	Reduce party role in transmitting voters' goals

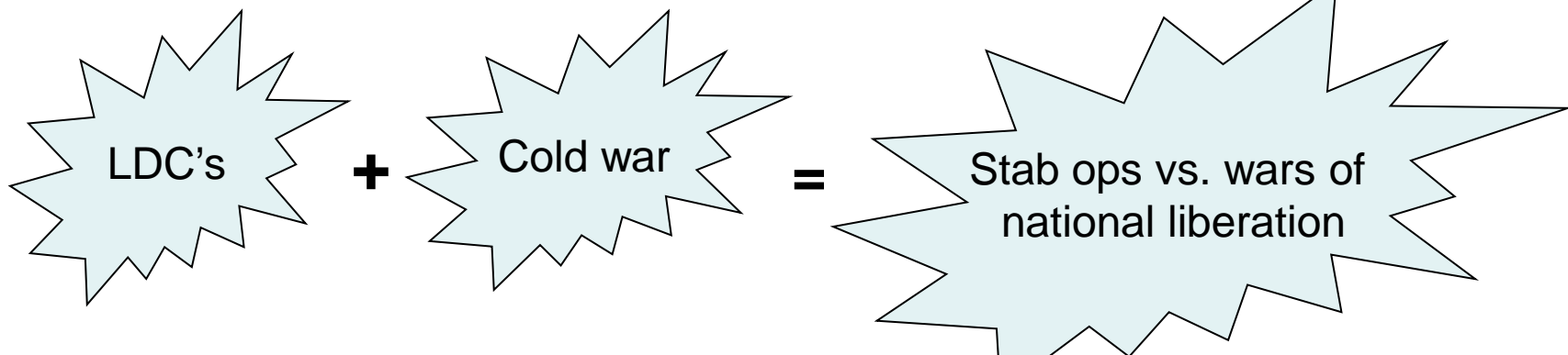

Aligning Stabilization Objectives Post NSS-2002

Military-led Stability Operations

Objective: Peace to enable civil authority in short term

Overarching Objective:
Establish civil security

Sub-objective:

- Dissuade Violence
- Build Security Capacity →
- Gain support of population (hearts and minds)

Interagency Phase IV/R&S

Objective: Viable Peace in short term

Overarching Objective:
Conflict transformation by mitigating root causes of conflict and build resiliencies

Sub-objectives:

- Establish civil security
- Mitigate root causes of instability ←
- Build civil & security capacity ←

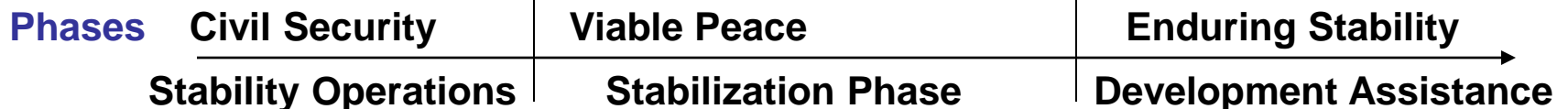
Civilian-led Development Assistance

Goal: Enduring stability over long term

Overarching Objective:
Mitigate root causes of instability

Sub-objectives:

- Democratic Governance
- Build Civil Capacity
- Economic Development



In Practice: On the Ground in Afghanistan

Concerns

Time needed for transformation

Reliably Identifying and mitigating root causes

Relationship of long term transformation and short term goals.

Aligning Operations on the Ground

1. Civil development assistance ↔ civil-security

2. Aligning objectives for unity of effort

3. Short- ↔ long-term objectives

Does Development Assistance = Support of Population in Patron-client Societies?

Patron-Client Societies

Support through patronage

Personal relations

Reciprocal obligations

Legal-Rational Societies

Support from providing public goods

Impersonal good will

Invisible hand

Implications

Getting support for development assistance

Legitimacy embedded in social relations

“\$ as ammunition” can buy support

Issue: Aligning Stabilization Objectives Where Patron-client Relations Prevail

Aligning objectives for civil-security and more transformational efforts

What's feasible in near term?

Root causes as an objective during Phase IV/RS stabilization operations?

Challenge of mitigating or reliably identifying root causes during Phase IV/R&S for unity of effort.

Cohering military and civilian led efforts?

Civilian long term development, working with with transformation

Room for Improvements?

1. Use \$ against hostilities, first? How much?
2. Trade-off: dealing with few authorities vs. \$ widely distributed?
 - Muhammad Yunus model: micro-projects?
3. Can we accept more of the local mores, e.g. patron-client relations, as part of the human terrain, and work with it?

Bottom line

- **Tailor and sequence efforts to the context (“human terrain”)**
- **Who what when where how; e.g.**
 - **\$ AAWS and patron-client relations**
 - **Some tribes, some ways, some places . . .**
